- How do I request an absentee ballot?** ► Contact your county clerk in person or by mail, phone, or fax. For absentee qualifications see <http://elect.ky.gov/registrationinfo/absenteeballot.htm>
- Where do I send the request?** ► See this website to find your county clerk:

- What is the deadline for requesting an absentee ballot?** ► Your request must be received no later than seven days before Election Day:
May 9 for the Primary Election
November 1 for the General Election
But if you have a medical emergency, you can apply for a paper absentee ballot until Election Day.
- What is the voting procedure?** ► Vote your paper absentee ballot exactly according to the instructions you receive with it.
Please note, if you do not qualify for a paper absentee ballot, you may still be able to vote "absentee" in your county clerk's office 12 or more days before Election Day. - What are the deadlines for voting absentee?** ► Ballots must be received by the close of polls on Election Day:
Primary Election: May 16
General Election: November 7
- What are the election dates and deadlines for 2006?** ► May 9: Last day for applications for absentee ballots for the Primary Election to be received by county clerks.
May 16: Primary Election: Absentee ballots must be received before 6:00 pm.
October 31: Last day for applications for absentee ballots for the General Election to be received by county clerks.
November 7: General Election: absentee ballots must be received before 6:00 pm.
